ESTABLISHMENT OF F.A. SCIENCE NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY: was approved as presented. BOARD REPORTS: Mr. Rogers reported that he attended a presentation by Pasi Sahlberg at St. Lawrence University along with Ms. Hunter, Mrs. Crossman-Dumas and Mr. Griffin. Mr. Sahlberg is from Finland and is a visiting professor at Harvard University. Ms. Hunter explained that she found the lecture very interesting, especially in the differences between the American school system compared to the Finnish school system. She also spoke about vast differences between Canada's educational system and America's, and she would be interested in visiting a school there at some point. She went on to report that the Finnish system has much less testing than America and prioritizes a more holistic approach with students. Mrs. Crossman-Dumas agreed, and spoke about the need to care for the entire child as they do in Canada and Finland. Mr. Rogers reflected that in those countries schools are much less structured, students participate in more recess and local schools have total control over the curriculum for their students. Mr. Griffin summed up the conversation by adding that the differences between teachers in the two countries, Finland versus America, are very small, it is the policy variations with respect to education philosophy that makes the two systems very different.
